Peter C. Gorman, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools Superintendent

Dr. Peter C. Gorman has been superintendent of Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools since 2006. He previously served as superintendent of the Tustin Unified School District in California for five years. Gorman began his education career as a teacher in Orange County Public Schools in Orlando, Fla., eventually serving as dean of students and as a middle school and high school assistant principal. After working as assistant superintendent of curriculum and instruction with Osceola County Public Schools and as a high school principal in Seminole County Public Schools, he returned to Orange County Public Schools, where he served in a variety of roles including area superintendent, chief information officer and chief operating officer for business and finance. Gorman has a bachelor's degree in education from Michigan State University, a master's in education and a doctorate in education from the University of Central Florida and an M.B.A. from Rollins College. Dr. Xavier De La Torre was named superintendent by the Socorro board of trustees in April 2009. Previously, De La Torre served for four years as associate superintendent for human resources in the Elk Grove Unified School District in Elk Grove, Calif., where he focused on the planning, recruitment, evaluation, compensation, compliance and retention of 3,200 certified employees and 2,400 classified employees. Prior to that, he served as associate superintendent for human resources in the Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District in Fairfield, Calif. He has six years experience as a high school principal and two years experience as an assistant principal. De La Torre also taught social studies and Spanish and coached football and baseball teams. He has a bachelor's degree in social science from California State University, Chico, a master's degree in educational leadership from the University of San Francisco, and a doctorate in education policy and administration from University of California, Davis. Jerry D. Weast, Montgomery County Public Schools Superintendent

Dr. Jerry D. Weast has been superintendent of Montgomery County Public Schools since his appointment 1999. He was reappointed in 2003 and 2007 and has announced that he will retire in June 2011. Weast has been a superintendent for 35 years, overseeing eight school districts in five states: Kansas, Montana, North Carolina, South Dakota and Maryland. In 2003, he was named Maryland Superintendent of the Year and was one of four finalists for National Superintendent of the Year. He also was North Carolina's Superintendent of the Year in 1998. Weast began his education career in 1969, teaching accounting and psychology in Kansas high schools before going on to become a principal at both the elementary and secondary levels. J. Alvin Wilbanks was named chief executive officer and superintendent of Gwinnett County Public Schools in 1996. At the time of his appointment, Wilbanks was serving as the school system's assistant superintendent of human resources and continuous improvement. Concurrently, he held the position of president of Gwinnett Technical College, the largest technical institute in Georgia and a school he opened as its president in 1984. During his 12 years as president of Gwinnett Tech, Wilbanks also served as assistant superintendent for occupational and continuing education and as director of vocational and technical education for Gwinnett County Public Schools. His education career began in the DeKalb County School System in Georgia, where he served as a teacher, assistant principal, and principal/director of the Occupational Education Center. He came to Gwinnett County from the Georgia Department of Education, where he was an administrator in the department's Industrial Development Unit. Wilbanks was named 2005 Georgia Superintendent of the Year and was one of four finalists for the 2005 National Superintendent of the Year. He earned bachelor's and master's of education degrees from the University of Georgia and an education specialist degree from Georgia State University.
